On several occasions, the most recent being March 11, 1985, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.


The question in this grievance is whether the Postal Service is violating the Privacy Act by requiring employees to wear their identification badge with their social security number exposed.
