Dear Mr. Wilson:

On July 26, 1983, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

This grievance concerns a local post office instruction that required a supervisor to accompany an injured employee to a local emergency treating facility on all initial occasions. - ఎక్కా - **మక్వి**క్యా సహహ కేషు ఈ కేషుకు కాల వై

During our discussion, we agreed that according to ELM 543.13, a supervisor accompanies an employee needing emergency medical treatment to the doctor's office or hospital, when appropriate, to make certain that the employee receives prompt medical treatment. However, according to ELM 543.223, a supervisor is not authorized to accompany the semployee to a medical facility or physician's office in nonemergency situations. The intent of the local instruction must not conflict with the ELM. If so, it shall be appropriately revised. has the as the was the to the second to
