Dear Mr. Wilson:

On January 3, 1983, we met on the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the 1981 National Agreement.

We mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case. Whether or not a past practice has been established at the Orlando office which provides employees time on-the-clock to file a protest in writing to the official in charge of their installation under the circumstances described in this grievance can be determined by evaluating the fact circumstances involved.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing if necessary. Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this letter as your acknowledgment of agreement to to remand this case.
