March 31, 1982, we met with you to discuss the soove-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

We mutually agreed that a blanket management order requiring medical documentation or other acceptable evidence of incapacity to work from <u>all</u> employees who call-in on a particular day, regardless of individual circumstances, goes beyond the intent of Part 513.361 of the Employee & Labor Relations Manual and should not be used.

Please sign the attached copy of this decision as your acknowledgment of agreement to resolve this case.
