On October 9, 1981, we met with you to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

We mutually agreed that there was no interpretive dispute between the parties at the National level as to the meaning and intent of Article XIX of the National Agreement at it relates to allowing employees to adjust their LSM chairs.

The parties should reasonably apply parts 1, 2, and 3 of Appendix F of the P-24 Handbook.

Accordingly, as further agreed, this case is hereby remanded back to Step 3 for application by the parties at that level and further processing, if necessary.
