On November 16, 1982, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure.

The question in this grievance is whether management violated Article XIX of the National Agreement by allowing the grievant 32 hours for scheme distribution keyboard training (autokey training).

It is our position that no national interpretive issue involving the terms and conditions of the national agreement is fairly presented in this case?
