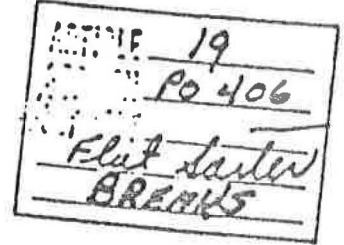

On March 27, 1984, we met to discuss the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the National Agreement.


The question raised in this grievance involved breaks for flat sorting machine operators.


After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case.
