On October 25, 1989, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether the National Agreement is violated by Supervisors completing passport application transmittal forms.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case. The parties further agreed that Section 422 of the Administrative Support Manual is applicable to the facts in this case.

Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing including arbitration if necessary.

The issue in this grievance is whether assigning Small Purchase Order Transaction (SPOT) Custodian duties to a supervisor violated the National Agreement.


