Dear Mr. Wilson:

On July 16, 1982, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure as set forth in Article 15, Section 2, of the National Agreement.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

The issue in this case is whether an acting supervisor (204-B) was improperly performing bargaining unit work on August 29 and 30, 1981.

Based on the acts as presented in our respective files, we mutually agreed that PSDS technicians, who are detailed to supervisory positions, are prohibited from performing bargaining unit work. This settlement will not prejudice either party in the current Article 1, Section 6 dispute presently in National level arbitration.


