Dear Mr. Tunstall:

On December 27, 1990, you met with Dave Stanton, of my staff, in a prearbitrationn discussion of the abovereferenced case.

The issue in this grievancce concerns examination requirements for clerk typpist and mark-up clerk automated positions.

During the discussion, it was mutually agreed that examination requirements wwill be prospectively revised so that examinations for clerrk-typist (tests 710 and 712) and for clerk-stenographer possitions (tests 710, 711, and 712) may be administered separaately to inservice applicants (current career employees)) to determine qualification for these positions and other positions requiring these examinations. Specific instructtions as well as applicable implementation dates will be published in a future Postal Bulletin.

Accordingly, we agreed to close this case.
