

Dear Mr. Wilson:

On April 25, 1983, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

The issue in this grievance is whether the grievant's backpay and annual leave were properly computed pursuant to his reinstatement by the MSPB on June 21, 1981.

After further review of the matter, we mutually agreed that there was no national interpretive issue farily presented as to the meaning and intent of Article 19 of the National Agreement.

This case is a purely factual dispute suitable for regional determination by application of Section 436 of the Employee and Labor Relations Manual.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to Step 3 for further development and consideration if necessary, by the parties.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this decision as acknowledgment of agreement to remand this grievance.

Time limits were extended by mutual consent.
