On September 16, 1984, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the forth step of our contractual grievance procedure.


This grievance involves EDITS on MPLSMS with EZR machines.

During our discussion, we agreed to resolve this case based on our understanding that individual EDITS below 95 percent on EZR machines, where the reason is due to abnormally high zero/400 bin errors suspected to be related to EZR keyboard problems, should not be made part of an employee's individual performance record or used in any discipline matters.

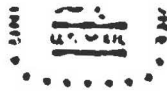

Dear Mr. Wilson:

On September 20, 1983, we met to discuss the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the 1981 National Agreement.

The question raised in this grievance involved the grievants being sent for remedial training after reaching an accuracy level below 95% on the LSM. The union contends that changes involving EZR are causing the problems.

After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case. We agreed that with reference to the EZR modifications, the August 6, 1982, memo from the APMG, Mail Processing Department, to Regional Directors, Mail Processing Department, Subject: EZR EDIT Reports, is to be applied.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing, if necessary.
