Dear Mr. Baldwin:

On September 29, 1982, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

The issue in this grievance is whether the grievant's EDIT was properly conducted and recorded.

After further review of the matter, we mutually agreed that there was no National interpretive issue fairly presented as to the meaning and intent of Article 37 of the National Agreement.

The issue in this case will be resolved by a determination of facts and their subsequent application to the M-16 EDIT Handbook. The major fact to be determined is whether the grievant was at the cited console when the EDIT was conducted.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to Step 3 for further development and consideration if necessary by the parties.


