Dear Mr. Wilson:

On June 2, 1981, we met with your representative to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

The question in this grievance is whether or not an employee temporarily added to an LSM crew should be added to the bottom portion of the random crew listing.

In our opinion, the M-16 Handbook is silent on how to assign employees to the EDIT list that have one (1) day assignments to an LSM crew. When employees are assigned to an LSM crew for a short duration and are placed on the random EDIT list they should be assigned the next number at the bottom of the list. However, the EDITS taken on the grievant for the dates in question will not be expunged from the records. As the method used did not adversely affect the EDITS.
