On May 7, 1985, we met to discuss the above-captionéd grievances at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The question in these grievances is whether management violated Articles 19 and 37, specifically the Engineering Data Isolation Technique Handbook, PO-407, (M-16), Section 644 concerning the edit cumulative size.

During our discussion, it was mutually agreed that the following would represent a full settlement of these cases:

In accordance with the Handbook PO-407 subsection 644.b., the total cumulative sample pieces shall remain at 750.
