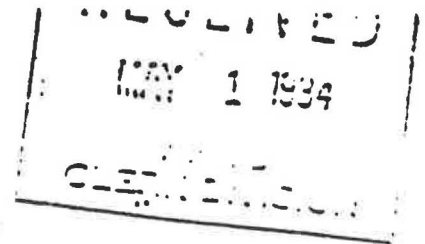

Dear Mr. Anderson:

On March 27, 1984, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.


The question raised in this grievance is whether CFS clerks are entitled to higher level pay when making labels for Associate offices.


After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case. Whether the subject employees are entitled to higher level pay can only be determined by application of Article 25, Section 2 to specifically what type of higher level work is being performed. Therefore, this case is suitable for regional determination.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing, if necessary.

Dear Mr. Newman:


On June 8, 1979, we met on the above-captioned case at step four of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the 1978 National Agreement.

During our discussion we mutually agreed that there is no interpretive dispute between the parties at the National level as to the existing criteria for determining whether an installation is entitled to have a position of Clerk-Finance Station, level PS-6. This criteria clearly states that this position is authorized in post office with one hundred (100) or more bargaining unit employees. No exception to this criteria is provided.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to step three for further discussion and resolution at that level.
