Dear Mr. Anderson:

On July 3, 1985, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether the disputed duties performed by the grievants when making repairs to a computer assisted keyboard trainer (CAKT) in the PEDC is level-9 work, thereby entitling the grievants to higher level pay.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case. Whether or not the disputed duties are higher level is a local dispute and suitable for regional determination based on an evaluation of the specific fact circumstances involved.

Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing.
