Dear Mr. Anderson:

On June 23, 1982, we met to discuss the above-captioned case t the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set orth in the 1981 National Agreement.

The question raised in this grievance involved the grievant's alleged entitlement to higher level pay for assisting "Loose-in-the Mails" Clerks and Directory Clerks.

After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no National interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case. Whether or not an employee performs higher level duties has to be determined by evaluating the fact circumstances involved.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing if necessary.
