On October 9, 1987, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether all FSM operators should be paid level 6.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case. The level of the flat sorting machine operators was established, and was not contested just as the SPLSM positions were. Non-scheme is level 5, scheme is level 6. Both are operator paced and appropriately compensated.

Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing, including arbitration if necessary.
