September 28, 1983, we met to discuss the above-captioned matter at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the National Agreement.


The questions raised in this grievance involved entitlement to a higher level pay for the grievant and whether the position of an Illustrator should be authorized for the St. Paul office.

After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that the national interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing and arbitration, if necessary.

Dear Mr. Tunstall:

On May 4, 1987, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether management violated the National Agreement by detailing Level 6 employees to perform Level 6 Expediter duties prior to utilizing Level 5 Star Route clerks.


After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case. This is a local dispute which may be resolved by application of Article 25, Section 4, of the National Agreement to the fact circumstances involved.


Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing, including arbitration if necessary.
