Dear Mr. Anderson:

On June 1 you met with Frank Dyer in prearbitration discussion of HLC-5F-C 19478, Colorado Springs, Colorado. The question in this grievance is whether a mail distributor, level 4, was properly detailed to a transit mail expediter position, level 6, in accordance with Article 25.

It was mutually agreed that the issues present in that discussion did not warrant arbitration at the national level. The case is being remanded to the regional level of arbitration with the clear agreement between the parties that it is to be arbitrated at the regional level. This agreement does not preclude either party, once the arbitration has begun, from exercising its rights to refer the case to Step 4 should national interpretive issues arise.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this letter acknowledging your agreement to remand this case, withdrawing HLC-5F-C 19478 from the pending national arbitration listing.

On April 11, 1984, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.


The question in this grievance is whether the grievant, a Mail Distributor PS-4, was properly compensated for work in the pouch rack area.


