Dear Mr. Baldwin:

On October 29, 1982, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

The question in this grievance is whether management violated Articles 19 and 25 of the national agreement, as it relates to job ranking and the denial of higher level pay.

The union contends that the grievant performs level 6 work in the registry section and is entitled to higher level pay. In addition, his position should be upgraded from level 5 to level 6.

After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case. A determination as to whether or not the grievant's position should be ranked at another level or whether he is entitled to higher level pay must be based on a review of the fact circumstances.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at step 3 for further processing if necessary.
