Dear Mr. Anderson:

On June 10, 1983, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

The question in this grievance is whether a PS-5 clerk is entitled to PS-6 pay for the time it takes to make entries on PS Form 5398. (Transportation Performance Record).

After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case.

The determination of whether higher level work was performed is a factual dispute suitable for regional determination. The parties at Step 3 should apply the core duties and responsibilities of KP-15 to the work performed and the time spent in performing the disputed work for a determination of whether higher level pay is warranted.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing if necessary.
