Dear Mr. Riley:

On April 6, 1978, we met with you to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

Based on the evidence presented in this grievance, we find that the National Agreement, Article XXII does not restrict local management from allowing the national alliance of Postal and Federal employees to place material on a bulletin board other than the bulletin boards of the certified bargaining representatives.

Therefore, it is our conclusion that no violation of the National Agreement occurred and the grievance is denied.

Questions have arisen recently with respect to the procedure to be followed when national or regional union officials or their designees desire to visit postal installations.

The policy with respect to implementation of the provisions set forth in Article 23 of the National Agreement have not changed. National union officers should give reasonable notice to the employer at the national level when desiring to visit postal installations, and regional union officials should give reasonable notice at the regional level when desiring to visit postal installations.

Should you be contacted directly by such union officials, you should advise them accordingly and then notify the regional Labor Relations Division.
