On June 20, 1983, we met to discuss the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the 1981 National Agreement.

The question raised in this grievance involved continuation of pay for an injury sustained while in a duty status.

After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case. We further agreed that Department of Labor instructions contained in letters dated September 20, 1982, and November 2, 1982 provides specific instructions to resolve this fact dispute.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing, if necessary.



On October 15, 1986, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether management violated the National Agreement by requiring grievant to use annual leave to attend a OWCP hearing.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case. We agreed this case should be returned to Step 2 to determine whether or not it has been resolved.

Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing, including arbitration if necessary.
