Dear Mr. Riley:

On April 19, 1977, we met with you to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

Part 271 of the Postal Service Manual applies to damage or loss of government property not loss or damage of private property. Based upon the foregoing, it was inappropriate to issue the referenced letter of demand to the grievant. Accordingly, the grievance is sustained.

By copy of this decision, local officials shall remove the letter of demand issued to the grievant.
