On July 2, 1987, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.


The issue in this grievance is whether management is in violation of the National Agreement by objecting to the union's selected sites, for local negotiations, which are outside the delivery area.



On July 2, 1987, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether or not failure to place the grievants in their new assignments within 14 days of the announcement listing them as the successful bidders violated the National Agreement.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case. Therefore, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for application of Item #21, (2)(F) of the GMF Wilmington, Delaware Local Memorandum of Understanding to the fact circumstances involved.
