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Dear Mr. Wilson:

On September 23, 1982, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

This grievance involved a performance evaluation of an employee in the CFS unit. The evaluation included a reference to "goals" of the unit. The Union contends that the evaluation was retaliatory and that local management has established local work and time standards for the CFS unit.

During our discussion, we agreed that, as stated in instructions issued by the Beadquarters Retail Operations Division on June 10, 1981, "The Postal Service does not have work or time standards for Computer Forwarding System productivity" We also agreed that until standards are developed nationally in accord with Article 34, failure to meet any locally established Computer Forwarding System production standards cannot be used as a basis for disciplinary action.

Regarding the performance evaluation, we agreed that the questions raised do not involve National interpretative issues.

Accordingly, we agreed to remand the case to Step 3 for compliance with the instructions quoted above and for further processing on the performance evaluating question if necessary. Please sign the attached copy of this decision as your acknowledgment of agreement to remand this case.
