On October 30, 1981, we met with you to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

We mutually agreed that there was no interpretive dispute between the parties at the National level as to the meaning and intent of Article XXXVII of the National Agreement as it relates to the procedures for the awarding of bids.


Data Collecting Technicians positions require applications, not bids.
