Dear Mr. Wilson:

On March 28, 1983, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

The question in this grievance is whether management violated Article 37 of the National Agreement by restricting bidding on two (2) Express Mail Service Clerk assignments to incumbent Express Mail Clerks. The union contends that the assignments should have been posted for application from all clerk craft employees who had completed their probationary period.

It is the position of the Postal Service that the assignments were posted in accord with Article 37.3.A. Craft employees eligible to bid were correctly identified as Express Mail Clerks.

As we find no contractual violation, the grievance is denied.


On February 10, 1987, David Cybulski met with Thomas A. Neill in prearbitration discussion of the above-captioned case.
