Dear Mr. Wilson:

On May 31, 1984, we rediscussed the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the 1981 National Agreement. We had previously agreed to hold the case in abeyance.

The question raised in this grievance involved whether the duty assignment of a 204B detailee should have been posted.

After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case. Whether a detail meets the requirements of Article 37.3.A.7. can only be determined based on individual fact circumstances.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing if necessary.

On May 25, 1982, we met to discuss the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the 1981 National Agreement.

The question raised in this grievance involved whether the procedure followed in assigning an employee to a 204b detail violated Article 37.3.A.7.

After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no National interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case. A determination as to whether the employee in question was detailed in excess of four months can only be made based on a review of the fact circumstances involved.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing if necessary.
