Dear Mr. Wilson:

On November 8, 1984, we met to discuss the above-captioned case at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure set forth in the National Agreement.

The question raised in this grievance involved whether or not the grievant was qualified for promotion to the position of Bulk Mail Dock Clerk.

After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case. We agreed that whether the grievant was qualified -- had taken and passed the examination -- at a specific point in time is not a question that requires national interpretation.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing and arbitration, if necessary.

On June 8, 1979, we met on the above-captioned case at step four of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the 1978 National Agreement.

During our discussion we mutually agreed that there is no interpretive dispute between the parties at the National level as to the existing criteria for determining whether an installation is entitled to have a position of Clerk-Finance Station, level PS-6. This criteria clearly states that this position is authorized in post office with one hundred (100) or more bargaining unit employees. No exception to this criteria is provided.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to step three for further discussion and resolution at that level.
