Dear Mr. Baldwin:

On April 30, 1982, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

We mutually agreed that there was no interpretive dispute between the parties at the National level as to the meaning and intent of Article 37 of the National Agreement as it relates to the posting and awarding of bids.

During our discussion, we concluded the following:

1. Local Job Number 6460 (#64) which was posted on November 6, 1981, and withdrawn on November 16, 1981, should have been awarded to the senior or successful bidder by November 26, 1981 (Article 37, Section 3.F.).
2. The grievant was eligible to bid and be named a senior or successful bidder for Job Number 6460 (#64).

Accordingly, as further agreed, this case is hereby remanded back to Step 3 for an appropriate remedy as may be devised by the parties at that level. If unresolved, it should be arbitrated at Regional level.

Please sign the attached copy of this decision as your acknowledgment of agreement to remand this case.
