Dear Mr. Baldwin:

On May 6, 1981, we met with your representative to discuss the pove-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our particular grievance procedure.

The matters presented as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

The question in this grievance is whether or not management violated provisions of Article XXXVII, Section 3.F.6., of the National Agreement by including an incidental typing requirement in a posting inviting bids for a Drafting Clerk, PS-5, SPI-17, position.

In our view, the question raised in this grievance does not fairly present a national interpretive issue. The position description for Drafting Clerk, SPI-17, includes typing duties. Under the circumstances, the inclusion of the incidental typing requirement in the posting is consistent with the provisions of Article XXXVII, Section 3.F.6., of the National Agreement which provides that such requirement must be reasonably related to the efficient performance of the responsibilities of the job.

In the absence of evidence which establishes that a violation f provisions of the National Agreement occurred, this ievance is denied.
