Dear Mr. Wilson:

On November 17, 1983, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The question in this grievance is whether the grievant is being improperly denied bids on window clerk duty assignments.

The facts in this case indicate that the grievant was removed from a window clerk position on June 25, 1983. Her removal was due to repeated out-of-tolerance audits. At present, the grievant is indefinitely barred from bidding on window clerk duty assignments.

During our discussion, it was mutually agreed that the following would represent a full nonprecedential settlement of this case:

The grievant will be precluded from bidding on another window clerk duty assignment until June 25, 1984. Thereafter, if the grievant becomes a senior bidder for a window clerk assignment, then the provisions of Article 37, Section 3.F.7, will apply.
