On June 29, 1982, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure as set forth in Article 15, Section 2, of the National Agreement.

The dispute at issue in the instant grievance is whether the grievant was improperly denied the position of Mailing Requirements Clerk.


After further review of the matter, we mutually agreed that there was no National interpretive issue fairly presented as to the meaning and intent of Articles 19 and 37 of the National Agreement.

To become a successful bidder for the above position, the grievant must have met the requirements as specified in the Standard Mail Classification Training Program. This is a fact determination to be made at the regional level.


Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to Step 3 for further development and consideration if necessary by the parties.
