Dear Mr. Baldwin:
On September 29, 1982, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance orocedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

The issue in this grievance is whether local management violates the National Agreement by not using seniority when assigning pool and relief clerks to temporary vacancies.

After further review of the matter, we mutually agreed that there was no National interpretive issue fairly presented as to the meaning and intent of Articles 37 and 30 of the National Agreement. The assignment of pool and relief clerks is done in accordance with the March 3, 1975 Memorandum of Understanding and Article 37 of the National Agreement.

The facts, as presented in our files, indicate a purely local dispute over the application. of the above-cited contractual language, the Local Memorandum of Understanding and local past practice.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to Step 3 for further development and consideration if necessary by the parties.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this decision as acknowledgment of agreement to remand this grievance.

Time limits were extended by mutual consent.
