On May 9, 1990, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether the standard Mail Classification Training Program should have been provided to an employee.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case. We further agreed to remand this case to the parties at the regional level for application of the Step 4 decision in case H7C-1K-C 20978 (copy attached).


Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing, including arbitration if necessary.
