Dear Mr. Baldwin:

On November 8, 1982, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

In this grievance, the union contends that when an employee makes multiple bids and indicates preferences on Form 1717, this also indicates his/her wish to remain live on other bids and satisfies the requirement of article 37.3.F.8.

It is the position of the Postal Service that indicating preference in assignments on Form 1717 does not satisfy the requirement of article 37.3.F.8 to notify management in writing of an election to remain a bidder on other assignments.

Accordingly, we find no contractual violation and the grievance is denied.
