On January 4, 1984, we met to discuss the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the National Agreement.

The question raised in this grievance involved training requirements for promotion of MPE-6 at the Providence Post Office.


After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case. We agreed that the question raised can be answered by applying the provisions of the Bloch arbitration award issued on case no. H1T-4P-C 6029 to the fact circumstances.
