On February 24, 1984, we met to discuss the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure.

The question raised in this grievance involved the rotation system on the Flat Sorting Machine (FSM).


After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case. The parties agree that the MPFSM operator rotating provisions as provided by the MPFSM 775 manual should be applied to the local dispute in order to resolve this case.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing if necessary.
