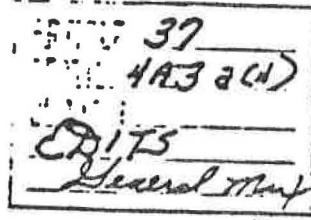

On September 27, 1982, we met to discuss the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the 1981 National Agreement.

The question raised in this grievance involved whether management violated Article 37 by charging the grievant with an error. The Union contends that the mail used in the EDIT was not a general mix.


After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no National interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case. Whether the mail was properly mixed for a particular EDIT is not a National interpretive question.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing if necessary.
