

Dear Mr. Wilson:

On January 13, 1984, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The grievance concerns whether a detail assignment, which has existed for approximately 2 years, should be posted for bid. Additionally, the union requests that the clerk craft employee serving in the detail be returned to his normal assignment.

We mutually agreed that the factual dispute in this grievance does not fairly present an interpretive question.

On January 25, 1984, it was learned that the employee has been permanently placed in the disputed assignment and his former assignment has been posted in accordance with Article 37, Section 3.A., of the National Agreement.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this decision as acknowledgment of agreement to resolve this case.
