
On May 22 we met in prearbitration discussion of HLC-3D-C 37622, Atlanta, Georgia. The question in this grievance is whether management may create a "call-in" list of employees required to document an unscheduled absence in lieu of utilizing the restricted sick leave method found in the Employee and Labor Relations Manual, Part 513.

It was mutually agreed to full settlement of this case as follows:

The documentation "call-in" list automatically requiring medical certification for all unscheduled absences will be abolished.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this letter acknowledging your agreement with this settlement, withdrawing HLC-3D-C 37622 from the pending national arbitration listing.
