Dear Mr. Anderson:

On January 26, 1983, we met to discuss the above-captioned 'rievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance rocedure.

here matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

The issue in this grievance is whether the seniority of an employee returned to the clerk craft in the local office was properly established.

The facts in this case indicate that the grievant returned to the clerk craft after approximately 11 months as a supervisor. The grievant's craft seniority date was reestablished wihout credit for the time spent as a supervisor.

It is the position of the postal Service that the grievant's craft seniority was properly established. The grievant's return to the clerk craft was on a voluntary basis. Article 37, Section 2.D.7.d.1. of the National Agreement provides . . "the seniority shall be established after ceassignment as the seniority the employee had when he/she oft that craft without seniority credit for service outside craft." It is also our position that no national rpretive issue involving the terms and conditions of the onal Agreement is fairly presented in this case.
