On April 8, 1981, we met with your representative to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

The parties mutually agree that the disclosure provisions set forth in Articles XV, XVII and XXXI, National Agreement intend that any and all information upon which the parties rely to support their position in a grievance is to be exchanged between the representatives to assure that every effort is made to resolve the grievance at the lowest possible level. Accordingly, provided managéments' file contains the supervisors request for disciplinary action of M. G. Edwards (Local APWU 851080) same should be made available to the Union.

Time limits were extended by mutual agreement.
