On April 24, 1980, we first met on the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the 1978 National Agreement.

The question raised in this grievance is whether local management properly deleted the names of employees from the copy of a "76" print-out furnished to the steward.

After reviewing the information provided, we mutually agree that if the names were relevant to the processing or resolution of a grievance, they should have been provided. Therefore, if the steward still desires the employee names, they will be furnished.
