Dear Mr. Morgen:

On September 18, 1972, we met with you to discuss the above captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you concerning this grievance, as well as the applicable contractual provisions, have been reviewed and given careful consideration. As a result of this review, we do not believe that the Postal Service has breached the National Agreement by virtue of the conduct complained of; therefore, the grievance is denied.

However, the Postal Service believes that as a matter of administration, besides the one paid designated APWU representative, the APWU may have present a designee representing a different craft within APWU at the Labor Management Committee meeting if there is an item on the agenda pertaining to that craft. That individual will be compensated on a no gain, no loss basis for time necessary to dispose of that specific item.
