Dear Mr. Wilson:

On December 8, 1983, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue presented is whether an EEO case can be settled in a manner that is contrary to the provisions of the National Agreement.

In this case, in settlement of an EEO complaint an employee was allowed to accrue seniority on both the Level 5 and Level 6 seniority lists.

During our discussion, we agreed that in full and final settlement of this case, and without prejudice to the position of either party in similar cases, any actions taken as a result of the employee's being retained on the two seniority listings are to be appropriately adjusted.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this decision as your acknowledgment of agreement to remand this case.
