WHAT WOULD PRIVATIZATION MEAN FOR YOU?

- You would not have a job with the U.S. Postal Service.
- You would no longer be covered by the contract between the APWU and the USPS.
- Your federal retirement benefits would be frozen and would not increase. New, not-yet-vested workers would lose their retirement.
- Your no-layoff clause and just-cause protections against unfair discipline and termination would cease.
- Your right to file grievances would be lost, unless you are working for a unionized private company. There would be no recourse for unsafe work environments, harassment, and more.

- Your wages, benefits, costof-living adjustments (COLAs), and financial and job security would be gone.
- Fair hiring practices for disabled veterans and people from all walks of life would likely cease.
- You would lose your health insurance with the Federal Employee Health Benefit (FEHB) plan.
- X All your benefits, like your sick, vacation, and holiday leave, would be gone.
- Your postal seniority and related benefits would be gone.
